
History of Austin Pets Alive!

501c3 org started in 1997 as an advocacy group



- Restructured in 2008 as rescue
 group intent on making Austin a No Kill City
- Started saving animals off the euthanasia list from Austin shelter first then spread to other shelters in Central Texas
- Substantial growth each year since 2008





Cost Per Animal

- Basic costs*
 - \$200 per healthy cat in the cattery
 - \$250 per healthy dog in our shelter



- Special needs costs (50% of our pets) examples
 - \$269 per bottle baby kitten
 - \$330 per Parvo puppy
 - \$750 per Behavior Challenged Dog

*costs include spay/neuter, vaccines, testing, housing, adoption staff/vehicles, and medical



Calculating what it would take to win

- Animals
- Staff
- Volunteer Teams
- Adoption events/promotions
- · What last year's winner did
- Funds
- Space





Calculations

Resource Needed

- Animals- Planned to adopt 831 w/o challenge, but would need to do about 2000
- Staff- 2.3 x increase for 3 months only
- Volunteer Lead Team-Needed at least 6 people on Committee
- Adoption Events/Promotionsenough to average 21 adoptions per day (had only planned on 13 per day)
- What last year's winner did increased by 78% or 1,007 during three month period
- Funds- our cost is \$250 per animal average x 1100 animals = \$275,000
- Space- need to find double the space


Where do we get these resources?

- Animals- reach out to neighboring community shelters to increase # of healthy pets
- Staff couldn't hire without committed funds
- Volunteer Teams
- Adoption events and promotions- Volunteer plea to organization/marketing team
- Funds- Save A Life Drive
- Space- get creative, increase foster homes.



- High foot traffic

Pressure Points

- Problem: Have to dramatically increase work load and expense but no real idea of whether we will win or not
- Chose to try to get through it.
 - If we can save a few hundred more animals, it is worth it



Pressure Point: Data Entry

FTE

- We have 1 FTE per 1,400 animals saved.
- Data was backed up almost immediately
 - Turns into unhappy adopters
 - Longer it goes on the harder it is to fix
- Do you hire or try to find volunteers?







Pressure Point: Intake

Widening the net

 Reached out to surrounding counties to immediately increase numbers



Requires:

- Evaluation
- Transport
- Intake vaccines/workup
- Photography
- Set up



Pressure Point: Disease

- Incidence of disease goes up when pull from many shelters
 - Distemper
 - Parvo
 - URI in cats
- Some municipal shelters control disease better than others

Solutions:

- Place in foster for quarantine
- Holding area in shelter
- Only work with shelters that do intake vaccines
- Require 5 days post vaccines before surgery or adoption events



Pressure Point: Spay/Neuter

Capacity

- Current staff could only do 1400 surgeries per month maximum
- Do you hire? outsource?
 - Difficult with no funds



Solutions

- Take animals that are already "worked up" by municipal shelter
- Engage volunteers to leverage efficiency in clinic
- Hold 1-2 "Spay Days" with volunteers



How did volunteers help with spay/neuter?

Volunteers jobs

- Check in
- Verify needs in computer
- Fill out log for techs
- "gopher"
- Pack washing/wrapping
- Recovery
- Cleanup
- Check out

Impact

- Allowed techs and doctors to focus on surgery
- Allowed 2 sets of surgeries to occur with no break
- 70 surgeries done in one day
- Spay Day



Pressure Point: Staff Overtime and Stress

Problem

- Everyone wants to win
- Hard to deal with volume
- Changing perspectives on how you handle the increase
- Increase the easiest saves the most
 - Even so, it is incrementally more work

Solution

- Celebrate milestones
- Cheerlead
- Figure out ways to help each other
- Engage volunteers





Lessons Learned

It's All Good

- You can do it if you work hard enough
- The increase doesn't seem so bad on the other side of the challenge
 - APA has maintained high rescue and adoption numbers
- If you are contemplating doing this, you probably have the capacity to grow and you should try regardless of the challenge
- It is a good excuse to push the boundaries of saving lives
 - Forces creativity
- The per animal cost of growth didn't hold true exactly
