Key Components



Public health and safety must be the primary concern

All transport agencies must be registered 501(c)3 agencies or a municipal agency

Identify disease concerns specific to local or geographic regions.



Discuss outcomes and returns: who is responsible if an animal can't be placed for adoption?



General Requirements



The relationship between Source and Destination organizations is a **collaboration** meant to have a positive impact on the communities of both agencies and the animals – short term and long term.





Goals of the Collaboration





- Not only transport animals...
- Develop a longterm solution to address the excess of animals in a source community



Source Agencies Must:











Have space and/or resource constraints that reduce options for adoptable animals.

Have professional veterinary staff or partnerships with veterinary staff to provide pretransport assessments

Have senior staff that is committed to the transport program and cultivation of transfer partnerships

Be in compliance with local, state and federal laws

Destination Agencies Must:





Have community demand for dogs, puppies, cats and kittens



Have capacity and space available for care; not euthanize for lack of those things



Have strong infrastructure to support incoming animals



Be in compliance with all local, state and federal laws






Potential Barriers
